
Our College Name

About this time 150 years ago, a young Italian boy was transferring from his primary school to a secondary school. His name was Guiseppe Melchiorre Sarto. He was called Bepi for short.

Bepi studied to become a priest. Later he became a Cardinal and in August 1903, Bepi was chosen as the new Pope. He took the name St Pius X.

Pope Pius X died in 1914 and was later canonised a saint.

Pupils

It is important that you attend college everyday.

If however, you are absent, your parent/guardian will receive a call from our parent call system to request a reason for your absence.

Leave of absence will only be granted for a Consultant and/ or Orthodontist appointments. An appointment card should accompany a written request from your parent/guardian and be presented to the Head of Year. You are encouraged to make dental/medical appointments outside college hours.

Parents/guardians, you have a statutory obligation to ensure your child attends college regularly.

Homework

The aim of homework is to help you to revise what has already been taught in class.

Write down your homework into your diary immediately after you receive it.

If you have difficulty with a particular homework explain this to your subject teacher.

Homework should be completed with care.

Inside your homework diary you will find all the college rules. Read them carefully.

What to do if:

You are ill in college or have an accident:

Tell a teacher. We have a first aider who looks after and cares for sick/injured children. Someone from the college will contact your parents. In an emergency you will be taken directly to the hospital.

You need to get an urgent message home:

Tell your form teacher who will try and sort the matter out for you.

You change your home address or phone number:

Pass on your new details immediately to your form teacher

You are having difficulty with some subjects:

Tell your class teacher or talk to your form teacher.

Something is worrying you:

Tell a teacher who will understand. We are here to listen and to help - we will try to do what we can.

Parents / Guardians

If you have any concerns you should contact your child's **Form Teacher** or **Head of Year**. Please use your child's homework diary to communicate with subject teachers.
